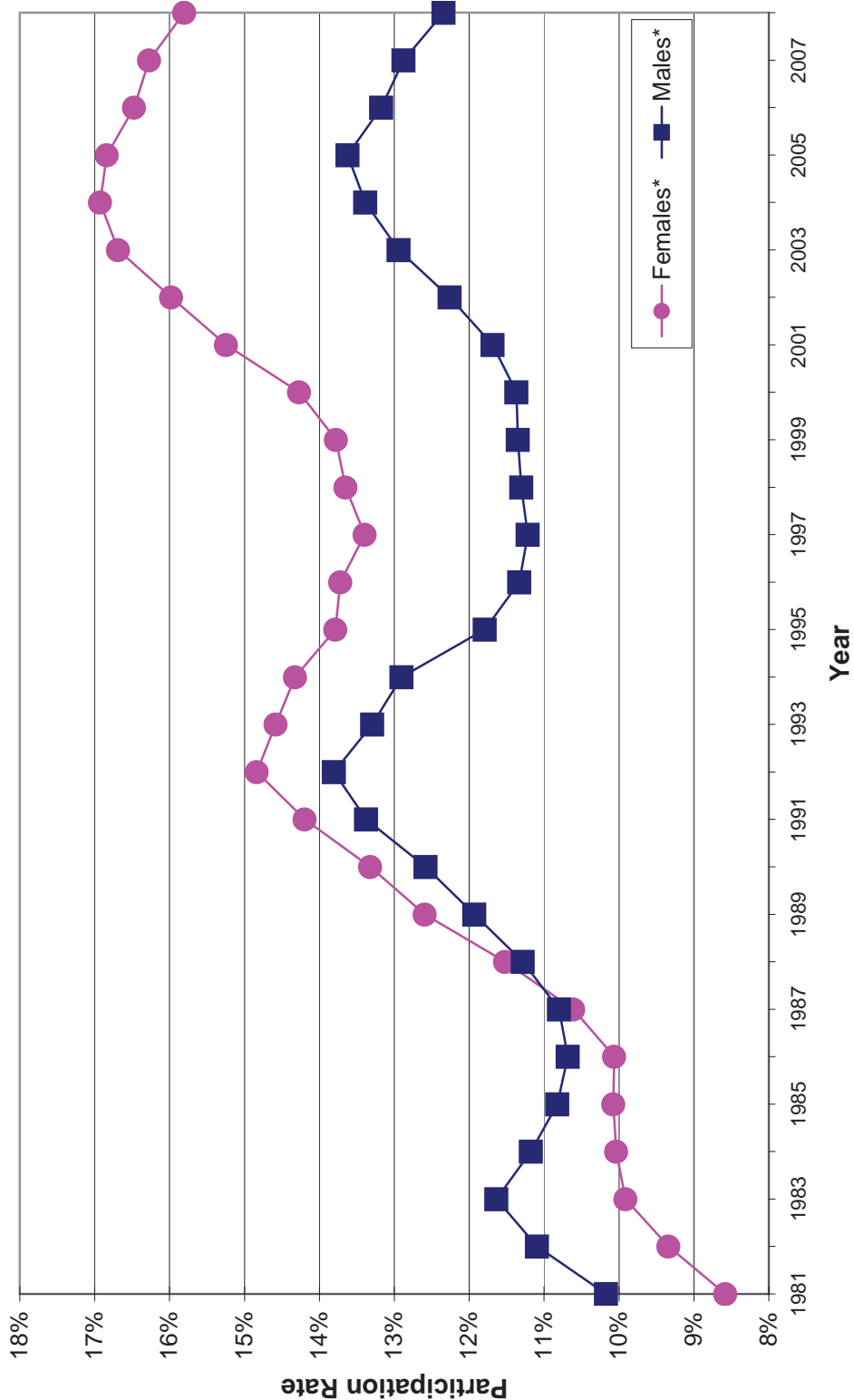
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**PARTICIPATION OF MALES AND FEMALES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA

5. The 'Other' category includes non-teaching units that received research revenues. Some examples of these units are Graduate Studies, University 1, Libraries, and Student Services. For this table, Graduate Studies is viewed as an administrative unit only. The FTE value shown in the 'Other' category belongs to Extended Education and Graduate Studies and is included in the 'Total \$/FTE Staff'.

6. The VIP Human Resources Management Information System counts all Geographic Full-time (GFT) staff in Medicine as 1.0 FTE each. Prior to the implementation of the VIP System, GFTs had FTE values ranging from 0.01 to 1.00. Due to this change in how FTEs are calculated for GFT staff, the Faculty of Medicine is shown separately for this year. The staff count methodology (especially in Medicine) is a work in progress; revisions will be made at a later date, as appropriate.
