**First Day of Classes - Fall Term Enrolment**  
**Summary Report**  
**September 4, 2014**

**Fall Term Enrolment**

Student enrolment for the First Day of Classes is 29,015, a decrease of 1.0% from last year's record setting First Day enrolment of 29,321. This marks the second time that enrolment has been above 29,000 students as at First Day of Classes. Full-time enrolment decreased slightly from 24,541 students to 24,505 students, while part-time enrolment dipped from 4,780 to 4,510.

Undergraduate enrolment decreased by 0.5%, from 25,225 students in Fall Term 2013 to 25,090 students in Fall Term 2014. Due to restructuring, the Department of Human Nutritional Sciences moved from the Faculty of Human Ecology to the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences, resulting in a shift in enrolments between these faculties.

Undergraduate student credit hours decreased 0.9%, from 285,374 in Fall Term 2013 to 282,796 in Fall Term 2014. Distance and Online Education credit hours increased 12.8%, from 22,828 credit hours to 25,740 credit hours.

Graduate enrolment decreased 4.7%, from 3,469 students to 3,306 students this year.

International enrolment increased 13.0%, from 3,750 students in Fall Term 2013 to 4,237 students in Fall Term 2014. The increase in international students was primarily at the undergraduate level, rising 15.9%. Graduate international enrolment increased by 4.8%.
