

## **Preliminary study of Teff (*Eragrostis tef*): Seeding rate and quality analysis**

### **Abstract:**

Teff (*Eragrostis tef*) is a warm-season annual grass that originates in northeast Africa, where it is commonly grown for forage and grain production. The Manitoba Diversification Centres at Arborg and Roblin examined seeding rates for teff (4-7 lb/ac), and compared it with the forage yield and quality of barley greenfeed. Significant differences were observed at both locations for forage yields across seeding rates. Additionally, forage quality at both locations varied according to the timing of the cut (mid- and late-season). Grain yield was measured only at the Roblin site and differed significantly by seeding rate.
