

ASPER SCHOOL OF BUSINESS / ÉCOLE TECHNIQUE ET PROFESSIONNELLE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

The *Asper School of Business* (Faculty of Management) at the University of Manitoba and *École technique et professionnelle* have established an Articulation Agreement whereby graduates of the Business Administration Diploma (University Stream) at École technique et professionnelle may seek admission to the Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) program at the University of Manitoba. Successful applicants will receive block transfer credit for their courses completed at École technique et professionnelle. Students admitted under the Asper School of Business/École technique et professionnelle Articulation Agreement in September 2019 and thereafter will be required to complete 66 credit hours at the University of Manitoba in order to receive the B.Comm.(Hons.) degree.

Admission under the Asper School of Business/École technique et professionnelle Articulation Agreement is limited to an annual quota and is competitive. Students must achieve a minimum grade point average of 3.00 on their Business Administration Diploma (University Stream) to be eligible for admission under the Articulation Agreement. Applicants are ranked in descending order of their grade point average and are admitted in that order until the annual quota is met.

REQUIRED COURSE WORK AT UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA for students admitted to Asper School of Business / ETP Articulation Agreement in September 2019 and thereafter:

Track 1/"Foundation" Courses for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (12 credit hours):

MATH 1520 OR MATH 1500 OR MATH 1230 Introduction to Calculus - 3 credit hours – minimum "C" required
 6 credit hours (minimum "C" required) from: Anthropology ANTH, History HIST, Mathematics MATH, Philosophy PHIL, Political Studies POLS, Psychology PSYC, or Sociology SOC
 Written English course from a specific discipline - 3 credit hours – minimum "C" required
 (ARTS 1110, GMGT 1010 and GMGT 2010 are not considered to be from a specific discipline and therefore do not fulfil the Track 1/"Foundation" Written English requirement.)

(Note: These courses must be taken either during the summer term prior to the student's admission to the Asper School of Business or during the first year at the University of Manitoba. Also, students who have not taken Math 40S (pre-Calculus) in High School will be required to take the University of Manitoba's Extended Education course in Mathematical Skills prior to enrolling in Calculus. ETP Articulation Agreement students who take the Mathematical Skills course will be allowed to use it as a 3 credit hour elective.)

Core Courses for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (27 credit hours):

- ENTR 2030 Introduction to Entrepreneurship: Business and Social Perspectives (3 credit hours)
- GMGT 1010 Business and Society (3 credit hours)
- GMGT 4010 Administrative Policy (3 credit hours)
- MIS 2000 Management Information Systems (3 credit hours)
- MSCI 2150 Introduction to Management Science (3 credit hours)
- SCM 2160 Supply Chain and Operations Management (3 credit hours)
- ***** Alternative Management Studies Requirement (3 credit hours)
 Students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter may fulfil this requirement by completing one of: GMGT 4210 (3 hrs), LEAD 3030 (3 hrs), MKT 3246 Sustainability Marketing (3 hrs); AGRI 3030 Cooperatives in Business and Community topic only (3hrs); ECON 2540 (3 hrs); LABR 2300 (3 hrs); NATV 3120 (3 hrs); NATV 4220 (3 hrs); NATV 4320 (3 hrs); POLS 3250 (3 hrs); POLS 3270 (3 hrs); SOC 3838 (3hrs). For Asper students, course prerequisites will be waived for: NATV 3120, NATV 4220, NAT 4320, POLS 3270.
- ***** Ethics Requirement (3 credit hours)
 Students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter may fulfil this requirement by completing one of: PHIL 2290 (6 hrs); PHIL 2750 (3 hrs); PHIL 2790 (6 hrs); PHIL 2830 (3 hrs); GMGT 3030 (3 hrs); or GMGT 3581 (3 hrs). If a 6 credit hour course is chosen, 3 credit hours will count toward the core Ethics requirement and 3 credit hours will count as electives if the elective is applicable to the student's program.
- ***** International Business Requirement (3 credit hours)
 Students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter may fulfil this requirement by completing one of: ACT 4250 (3 hrs); FIN 3450 (3 hrs); HRIR 4520 (3 hrs); INTB 2200 (3 hrs); MKT 3240 (Cross-Cultural Brand Management topic only) (3 hrs); MKT 3300 (3 hrs); or SCM 3230 (3 hrs).

Major Courses for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (12 credit hours):

12 credit hours in one of the approved Business Majors

Note: ETP Articulation Agreement students wishing to major in Finance are required to take FIN 2200 Corporation Finance (3 credit hours) as one of their Business Options (see below) and achieve a minimum grade of C+.

Business Options for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (9 credit hours):

9 credit hours of Business courses at the 2000 level or higher [Exception: Language courses used as Business Options by students who have completed the International Business major are not required to be at the 2000 level or higher.]

Business Option or Elective for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (3 credit hours):

3 credit hours at the 2000 level or higher: Business Option or non-Business Elective

Electives for students admitted in September 2019 and thereafter (3 credit hours):

3 credit hours: non-Business course that fulfils the Written English requirement

Total Credit Hours Required at University of Manitoba for students admitted to the Asper School of Business / ETP Articulation Agreement in September 2019 and thereafter: 66 credit hours
