The Canadian Longitudinal Study on Aging: Overview and research opportunities

We are featuring a talk by Dr. Verena Menec, Professor, Community Health Sciences. Dr. Menec is also the Manitoba site lead of the Canadian Longitudinal Study on Aging (CLSA), the largest study on aging ever conducted in Canada.

Dr. Menec will provide an overview of the CLSA which involves about 50,000 people aged 45–85 at time of recruitment, and follows them for at least 20 years. The study collects information on the changing biological, medical, psychological, social, lifestyle, and economic aspects of people's lives as they age, and includes COVID-specific information. Students will learn about the CLSA, how data may be accessed for future studies and thesis projects, and students will be invited to ask questions.
