He serves as final copy editor and manages all aspects of the publication process. Dr. Tchamouridze also oversees the Centre's website, leads the Northern/Aboriginal Outreach program, and teaches defence and security courses at the UM, and through continuing education.

Besides the Centre staff, Dr. Fergusson (Director), Dr. Jacoby (Deputy Director – on mat leave), Dr. George MacLean (Chair, Dept. of Politics), Dr. Tchamouridze (Research Associate) and Mrs. Heather Bowers (Administrative Assistant), the number of faculty attached to the Centre listed above represent the total number of Centre Research Fellows. The Centre does not formally hold background briefings for the media, although invitations are sent when possible (public events for attribution) to all media outlets in Winnipeg / Manitoba. Every media interview undertaken by members of the Centre in one way or another entails a preceding background brief – questions being asked by the media representative to prepare for the interview. In addition, members are also contacted by media for additional information that never appears in public. In some cases, members of the Centre forward the media to other members of the SDF community more knowledgeable on the topic at hand. In most cases, these are not tracked by the Centre, but would likely be around the same number of formal interviews.
