He is a long-time member of Winnipeg's Indigenous Writers Collective. He was also a contributor to *ndncountry*, the special joint issue of *Prairie Fire* and *CV2*. Duncan lives in Winnipeg.

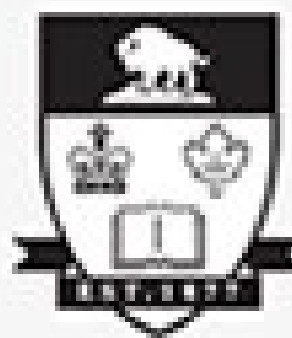
