

## Advanced Registration Form for St John's College Members (2008/09)

St John's College (SJC) members may use this form to request advanced registration in sections of University of Manitoba courses taught at SJC in Fall Term 2008 and Winter Term 2009, and in corresponding lab sections for those courses (even if the lab is held in another building).

Requests for advanced registration must be submitted by fax (204) 474-7610 or in person no later than **4:30 pm July 10/08**. Advanced registration submissions will be processed by the SJC Registrar between **8:30 am July 9** and **noon July 11/08**.

Students who miss the advanced registration period may register in SJC courses using Aurora Student on or after their initial Registration Time, provided there is space in the course and they meet the course prerequisites. You may determine your initial Registration Time at Aurora Student.

Students must meet all University of Manitoba requirements and course prerequisites. Students who have been placed on hold status are not eligible for advanced registration.

SJC membership is open to all students of the University of Manitoba. Students can declare St John's as their college of membership using Aurora Student once they have received their letter of acceptance from the U of M. A membership fee will be added to the tuition fees of SJC members.

## CODES USED:

**Courses taught together:** a two-digit code following the CRN indicates that the course is being taught along with another course that shares the same code. For example, ANTH 4790 and 7410 are being taught together.

**(M)** indicates that the course satisfies the university mathematics requirement.

**(W)** indicates that the course satisfies the university written English requirement.

**+** indicates that the course may be used toward partial fulfillment of the requirements for the Canadian Studies program.

**LAB** indicates lab sections held in St John's College only. See Aurora Student for a complete listing of all available labs for that course. If a course has a lab requirement, you must register in both the course and an associated lab section.
