### Prison Ministry

As part of monthly visits to the inmates of Stony Mountain Penitentiary join in a commitment of preparing personally with reflections on the Sunday liturgy and coordinating the pre-and post-visit sharing amongst other students. Advance security clearance is necessary.

### Development and Peace

Supported and promoted by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, participate in fall and winter workshops and campaigns which increase awareness and effect change on a local and International level.

### Breakaway Saturday Winnipeg Harvest

Winnipeg Harvest relies on volunteers for nearly every aspect of their operation. Take time out from your books and assignments to volunteer sorting food for the disadvantaged.

### CCSA Global Connection

Travel in early May to a developing country and experience "reverse mission." Learn about social justice issues, Catholic social teaching and how to live differently to influence positively the lives of those in developing nations. Fund-raising commitment required.

### L'Arche Canada

Often called the "school of the heart" established by Jean Vanier, this is an opportunity to experience community life, make friends and get experience that matters. You will have opportunities to teach and learn new skills, develop communications and be part of a team. Possibilities for employment do arise.

### Inner City Ministry

Spend a couple of hours on a Sunday serving the hungry in Winnipeg's core area from the Soup Kitchen at Immaculate Conception Parish or on a Saturday afternoon connect with young children of the inner city at Rossbrook House.

### Mass

Masses are held Tuesday to Friday at 11:45 am and Sunday at 11:00 am in Christ the King Chapel. Join our Worship Team as a cross-bearer, lector, altar server, communion Minister, usher or member of the hospitality crew. If you love music and song, join the Team as a singer or musician.

### Overflow Worship and Praise

What could be better than some quality prayer time, excellent music and a night out with friends. Each month join in worship and praise with Eucharistic Adoration.

### Retreats

In October, travel to Holland, MB to experience a weekend of prayerful silence and solitude based around the Office of Hours of Prayer and have a glimpse of a Trappist monastic life. In January/February, enjoy praying with Scripture at your own apartment, in a one-week Busy Students' Retreat.

### Discussion Groups

Spiritual Book Club: Monthly book club readings and discussions on faith and spiritual life.

Selected Topics Bible Study: Interested students meet for an organized Bible Study e.g. the miracles of Jesus and/or a study of St. Paul's life and teachings.

### Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

Interested in becoming a Catholic? The RCIA is the process through which interested adults are gradually introduced to the Roman Catholic faith and way of life. If you are Catholic but have not completed the reception of your sacraments this is the process of gathering and learning.

RCIA runs weekly from late September until early May.

Stay tuned for other ecumenical and interfaith events such as the Shabbat Prayer and Dinner evening at a local synagogue usually held in early February.
