1. Completed Application Form;
2. Letter of Reference;
 - a. Applicant must consult award criteria regarding letters of reference. Letters may be submitted electronically directly by the referee to the Office of the Associate Dean (Graduate & Research) at adrg.education@umanitoba.ca or submitted with the application package by the applicant.
3. Demonstration of Achievement:
 - a. Statement of Achievement no more than 500 words speaking to award criterion; and/or
 - b. Curriculum Vitae to demonstrate award criteria (e.g., professional/teaching experience, educational leadership, service, professional development, teaching innovation; etc.); and
4. *Optional supplemental information (see award criteria on next page).*

MANITOBA TEACHERS' SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP: Candidates will be required to submit an application that includes a statement (max. 500 words) and one letter of reference, each describing how they meet the criteria. One scholarship of \$3,000 will be offered to a graduate student who is enrolled part-time or full-time in the Faculty of Graduate Studies in a Master's or Ph.D. program delivered by the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba; has achieved a minimum grade point average of 3.5 based on the previous 60 credit hours (or equivalent) of study; has demonstrated education leadership through either: (a) involvement with the Manitoba Teachers' Society locally, (b) work as a school administrator in a Manitoba school, or (c) informal leadership within the broader educational community.

BETTY A. NICKS FELLOWSHIP: The fellowship will be awarded to a student who is pursuing a Master of Education degree. Preference will be given to full-time graduate students. Selection will be based on academic merit (minimum grade point average of 3.6 based on the last 60 credit hours) and professional, non-paid contributions to extra-curricular school activities, professional committees, etc., occurring in the two years prior to application for this award. The fellowship is renewable for a one-year period if the recipient continues to make outstanding progress (minimum grade point average of 3.6 and/or a satisfactory progress report). The fellowship may be offered as a "top-up" (supplementary) award to a UMGF recipient or as a "stand alone" (independent) award.

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA MANITOBA MARY E. LAMONT FELLOWSHIP: The fellowship will be awarded to an education student who is enrolled either full-time or part-time in a Master's or PhD program in the Faculty of Graduate studies, or in the Post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Education (PBDE). Selection will be based on academic merit (minimum grade point average of 3.5 based on the previous 60 credit hours of study). Candidates must have at least two years of teaching experience and demonstrated excellence in teaching. Candidates will be asked for a letter of support from one of the following: Department Head, School Administrator familiar with the candidate's teaching, or Graduate Advisor. Optional Documentation may include (a) evidence of innovative assignments, imaginative class activities, special evaluation methods, etc. used in a course; (b) evidence of leadership activities in the area of teaching, volunteering, conducting workshops, program development, work on committees; (c) evidence of efforts to extend their own teaching methods/experiences such as current professional development, university courses, action research; and (d) other evidence of outstanding teaching or teaching-related performance.

RUTHLEE TESKEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP: The fellowship will be awarded to a full-time student enrolled in the Inclusive Education Specialization of the Master of Education program delivered by the Faculty of Education. Selection will be based on academic merit (minimum grade point average of 3.5 based on the last 60 credit hours or equivalent), and demonstrated qualities of motivation, compassion and original thought. Candidates' will be required to provide a letter of reference (maximum 500 words) from an Inclusive Education instructor or professor that describes how the candidate meets the criteria.
