Arts or Management Courses

Students are required to take a total of 6 credit hours from the Faculties of Arts or Management (Asper School of Business) at the 1000 level or higher, in addition to the first year Written Requirement. Students usually take a 3 credit hour course i n first year, and a 3 credit hour course thereafter. However, students may take a 6 credit hour course to satisfy both requir ements.

Any Arts or Management course qualifies except ARTS 1110 - Introduction to University. ENG 1900 Occupational Health an d Safety Awareness also qualifies.
