Proof of having achieved a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5 (a current academic transcript) – web transcripts are accepted for UOM programs only. Transcripts from external institutions need to be office transcripts.

Have demonstrated a commitment to disseminate the results of research

Submit a one (1) page statement explaining how research relates to Aboriginal issues and how this research will be disseminated in order to be considered for the award

Normally, this scholarship is not awarded to a student entering the first year of graduate program. Recipients may receive this award only once.
