### Fall 2022 Bachelor of Midwifery Admission Requirement Update

The following changes have been made to the admission requirements for the Bachelor of Midwifery (BMid) program and will be in effect for applicants for the Fall 2022 intake. It is important to review this document in conjunction with the [Applicant Information Bulletin](#) to ensure that you have understood all admission requirements and policies for the intake for which you apply.

#### CASPer™ Situational Judgement Testing

Situational judgement testing will become an eligibility requirement for all applicants to the Bachelor of Midwifery program effective for the Fall 2022 intake. Applicants must complete the Computer-Based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics (CASPer™) to be eligible for consideration.

For admission under the Regular Category, a composite score will be calculated from both the AGPA (70%) and the CASPer™ score (30%). The composite score will determine the applicant's placement on the rank-ordered selection list.

CASPer™ shall not be used in the selection of applicants from the Canadian Indigenous Category. However, as applicants from the Canadian Indigenous Category may also be considered in the Regular Category, the CASPer™ must be written by all applicants to the Bachelor of Midwifery program.

## AGPA Calculation Change

As a result of the course requirement changes, the core average used toward the Adjusted Grade Point Average (AGPA) for admission purposes will be calculated on the most recent attempts of the following courses:

- BIOL 1410 Anatomy of the Human Body
- BIOL 1412 Physiology of the Human Body
  - (or BIOL 2410 and BIOL 2420)
- MBIO 1220 Essentials of Microbiology
  - (or MBIO 3010)
- NATV 1220 Indigenous Peoples in Canada, Part 1 and NATV 1240 Indigenous Peoples in Canada, Part 2
  - (or NATV 1200 Indigenous Peoples in Canada)

Please note that there will be no change in the formula used for calculation of the AGPA, only in the courses used in the core average portion of the calculation. See the [Applicant Information Bulletin](#) for more information.
