## German Program

### Bachelor of Arts (Honours)

Since the academic year 2006/07, it is possible to do a **four year degree** in German at the University of Manitoba again.

You can do either a **Honours Single** or a **Honours Double** (two subjects).

#### Advantages

- 4 year degree
- higher qualification for a wide range of careers
- higher specialization in one or two subject areas
- recommended for students seeking entrance to graduate study

#### Honours Double – other subject

German can be combined with the following subjects: Economics, English, French, History, Philosophy, Political Studies, Psychology, Religion, Sociology, Women Studies

#### Entrance Requirements

1. 6 credit hours from each of 4 different subject fields
2. 3.0 GPA in intended Honours subject(s)
3. 3.0 CGPA

Students must apply to the Honours degree program in the Dean's Office, Faculty of Arts

#### Further Requirements

- Minimum time to graduate: Four years of full-time study (University 1 plus three years). There is no time limit to complete the degree.
- You must maintain a 3.0 GPA at all times.

**Exchange Programs:** The German program & the University of Manitoba offer several opportunities to study abroad, in particular the **Canadian Year in Freiburg** and the Manitoba-Trier University exchange, as well as annual work and summer programs.

#### Other degrees offered in German

- Undergraduate Programs: **General Major** (3 year B.A., 30 credit hours, must include GRMN 3200, and GRMN 2120 or GRMN 2130 or GRMN 2140), **Minor** (18 credit hours in any German class)
- Graduate Program: **Master of Arts** (M.A.) in German

## **Honours Single in German (requirements)**

### First Year / University 1

- Either GRMN 1120: Beginning German (6)  
or GRMN 2100: Intermediate German (6)<sup>1</sup>

### Second / Third Year

- GRMN 2120: Introduction to German Culture 1 (3)  
or GRMN 2130: Introduction to German Culture 2 (3)
- GRMN 2140: Exploring German Literature (3)  
(or former 8.245: Twentieth Century German Literature)
- GRMN 3200: Deutsche Sprachpraxis 1 (6)
- 18 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 2000, 3000 or 4000 level
- 30 credit hours in ancillary options

### Fourth Year

- GRMN 4600: Senior Seminar in German Studies (3)
- GRMN 4570: Honours Thesis in German Studies (3)
- 6 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 4000 level<sup>2</sup>
- 6 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 3000 or 4000 level

## **Honours Double in German (requirements)**

### First Year / University 1

- Either GRMN 1120: Beginning German (6)  
or GRMN 2100: Intermediate German (6)<sup>1</sup>

### Second / Third Year

- GRMN 2120: Introduction to German Culture 1 (3)  
or GRMN 2130: Introduction to German Culture 2 (3)
- GRMN 2140: Exploring German Literature (3)  
(or former 8.245: Twentieth Century German Literature)
- GRMN 3200: Deutsche Sprachpraxis 1 (6)
- 12 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 2000, 3000 or 4000 level
- 24 credit hours in other honours field
- 6 credit hours in ancillary options

### Fourth Year

- GRMN 4600: Senior Seminar in German Studies (3)
- GRMN 4570: Honours Thesis in German Studies (3)
- 3 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 4000 level<sup>2</sup>
- 3 additional credit hours in German courses numbered at the 3000 or 4000 level
- 12 credit hours in other honours field

<sup>1</sup> In exceptional circumstances (with written consent of department head), students with superior language ability may replace GRMN 1120 or GRMN 2100 with GRMN 3200. In this case, GRMN 3200 listed under Year 2 or 3 of each program must be replaced with 6 credit hours in German in order to complete requirements.

<sup>2</sup> Students enrolled in the fourth year of the Honours program may be permitted to substitute up to 6 credit hours of graduate level courses.
