Statement of Intent

Complete a brief (750 words) three page statement of intention and one page bibliography for your thesis research. Reviewers will stop reading after 3 pages of text (not including the bibliography). Your objective is to demonstrate that your research topic is important and doable based on a short literature review. The Graduate Program Admissions Committee is particularly interested in discerning your writing ability and capacity to use reference materials, so please ensure that your proposal does include references.

Clearly and succinctly, state:

1. The proposed research topic and the overall purpose of your research. Indicate how your research will make a significant contribution to knowledge in Native Studies and where and how it builds on existing knowledge within the discipline (i.e., the relevant literature).
2. How you will engage in the study. Include a brief statement of the theoretical and methodological presuppositions that provide the foundations for your research. Indicate any community involvement or support for your research proposal.
3. Academic sources that have inspired your project.
