COURSE OBJECTIVES

To study Marx's Capital Volume I

ASSIGNMENTS:

1. Weekly 3-page essays on the reading assigned for that week. Of the 5 which will be assigned, students are expected to do 4 of them. (The first two, however, are compulsory) This will count for 60% of the final grade.
2. A final 10-page paper, (about 2800-3000 words), whose subject will be assigned two weeks before the final class and will be due for that class. This will count for 40% of the final grade.
3. In addition, students will be called upon to lead the discussion during the first hour of the weekly seminar. Two students per week will be assigned this function; it will involve preparing questions and subjects for discussion.

No make-up or late assignments except for legitimate reasons.
