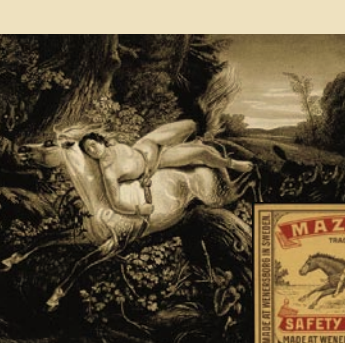
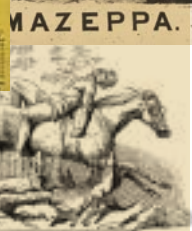

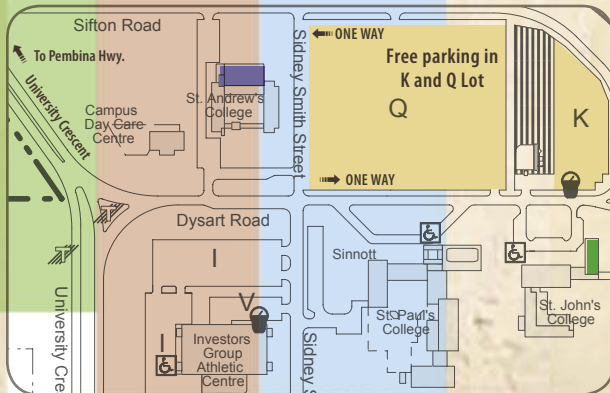

Written for female voices and composed to an English libretto, the work features soaring choruses and delightful melodies, telling the story of Byron's romantic hero.
