## I got accepted! What should I do now?

Do your research! <b>Read the Riddell Handbook</b> and explore the Riddell Faculty web site:
http://umanitoba.ca/environment
Send in your final transcripts and check your application status (if conditionally accepted).
Log into your <u>Aurora Student</u> account with your Student ID and if logging into Aurora Student for the first time, enter your date of birth as your PIN (YYMMDD). Check your <i>Enrolment and Academic Records</i> tab for your registration date and familiarize yourself with Aurora Student.
Browse through the <u>Academic Calendar &amp; Catalog</u> and check out all the different degree options the Riddell Faculty has to offer.
Register for your classes on Aurora. Direct entry students can register as early as July 13-19. Consider registering in an academic support program as well:  Supplemental Instruction – Supplemental Instruction sessions are weekly review sessions that are available to students in historically difficult classes. These voluntary sessions offer students an opportunity to:  interact on an informal basis  ask questions about the course  compare notes  discuss course content  solve practice problems  and develop study strategies  For more information, click here. Find out what textbooks you need for your courses in Aurora Student under <i>Enrolment and Academic Records -&gt; Student Records -&gt; View Booklists</i> and purchase them.
Find a place to live (if you are not living at home). For information about on-campus housing, click <a href="here">here</a> .  If you are interested in residence, make sure to apply early! You can also check the classified section of local newspapers to see ads for housing. Remember that in many cases, expenses such as phone, gas, and electricity are paid separately from rent expenses.
