The environmental degradation (eutrophication) of Lake Winnipeg is what is known in government as a "wicked problem." Many factors have contributed to it; the proposed solutions are costly and contentious; and to respond to the full scope of the problem a concerted effort will be needed.

In this course, Lake Winnipeg will be used as a case study to explore the use of science in the formulation of public policy; feasible ways for policy-makers to approach large and complex issues; and the construction of policy implementation networks linking governments, NGOs and citizens.

The course will combine seminar discussion, independent research and a series of symposia featuring invited experts.
