

## Clinical Psychologist – Crisis Response Centre & Adult Eating Disorders University of Manitoba & Shared Health

The Department of Clinical Health Psychology in the Max Rady College of Medicine, University of Manitoba in collaboration with the Clinical Health Psychology Program, Shared Health (SH), invite applications for a Contingent Geographic Full-Time Clinical Psychologist (**Position#28599**), with a flexible start date, ideally **May 1, 2020** or as soon as possible after. The position integrates clinical and academic roles (typically 80% clinical; 20% applied research/clinical teaching). The successful applicant will be appointed to the Medical Staff of the CHP Program, Shared Health and will be appointed to the Department of Clinical Health Psychology, Max Rady College of Medicine at the rank commensurate with experience, typically Assistant Professor.

This position serves two clinical areas, with the majority time based at the Crisis Response Centre (CRC), and the minority time in the Adult Eating Disorders Service, Health Sciences Centre, adjacent to the CRC. The CRC is a 24/7 facility that provides diagnosis and treatment services for adults with acute or crisis mental health presentations, in an environment that promotes healing and recovery. The Adult Eating Disorders Clinic offers a hospital-based day treatment service model. The Clinical Psychologist will be part of both the CRC and Eating Disorders interdisciplinary teams, which include psychiatrists, counsellors, nurses, and dietitians. The Psychologist will provide direct service including group-based and individual treatment and diagnostic assessment, as well consultation across both services. There is also a role for development and implementation of clinical programming.

### Position Responsibilities:

- Development and delivery of clinical programming, including group-based interventions
- Psychological consultation to the CRC and Eating Disorders teams
- Short-term outpatient psychological therapy
- Psychodiagnostic and cognitive assessment for complex mental health presentations
- Facilitate professional development for other health providers, where applicable
- Clinical supervision and teaching of psychology residents in our CPA-accredited residency program; teaching of medical students and learners from other health professions.
- Applied clinical research and program evaluation.

### Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree (PhD or PsyD) in Clinical Psychology from a CPA (or APA) accredited training program.
- Completion of a CPA (or APA) accredited Internship/Residency.
- Registered or eligible for registration as a C. Psych by the Psychological Association of Manitoba [www.cpmb.ca](http://www.cpmb.ca)
- Education, training and experience in evidence-based individual and group-delivered psychological treatments for adults, including Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT)
- Education, training and experience in the administration and interpretation of standard adult psychological tests and measures.
- Training, experience, and/or research background and interests in Indigenous health issues an asset.
- Education, training and clinical experience in adult eating disorders is an asset
- Excellent interpersonal relationship skills, oral and written communication, and inter-professional teamwork skills
- Satisfactory results of pre-employment criminal records, vulnerable person and child and adult abuse registry checks.

### Salary and Benefits:

- Placement on WRHA salary scale will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
- Attractive benefits package is available through the University of Manitoba.
- The Geographical Full Time (GFT) agreement provides the opportunity for on-site private practice.
- The Clinical Health Psychology Program will provide the required clinical supervision for individuals at the C.Psych. Candidate level, until they are registered.

Clinical Health Psychology is unique in Canada, being both an academic department in the Max Rady College of Medicine and a regional clinical program, with a strong collegial network of psychologists across the province.
