

## **Manitoba Lotteries Corporation – Lloyd LeVan Hall Memorial Scholarship**

The Manitoba Lotteries Corporation offers an annual scholarship, to assist Aboriginal students pursuing post-secondary education in the Asper School of Business. The Lloyd LeVan Hall Memorial Scholarship commemorates the extraordinary life and contributions of Lloyd LeVan Hall, who served as Vice-Chairperson of the Board of Directors for the Manitoba Lotteries Corporation from 2000-2007.

**AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP: \$2,000**

One scholarship, valued at \$2,000, will be offered to an undergraduate student who:

1. is Aboriginal (Status, non-Status, Metis, Inuit);
2. is a Canadian citizen;
3. in Fall/Winter 2010-2011, was registered in at least 18 credit hours\* \* ;
4. in Fall/Winter 2011-2012, is registered in at least 18 credit hours\* \* as a student in the Asper School of Business;
5. has a minimum degree grade point average of 3.00;
6. has demonstrated community involvement through volunteering.

*\*\*To be eligible for this scholarship, students completing an Asper Co-op Work Term during this time period must have completed at least 9 credit hours (60% course load) during each of their academic terms.*

### **APPLICATION**

Please submit a) the application form; b) a one-page letter (maximum 200 words) describing your contributions to the community through volunteering. Candidates who meet the criteria may be interviewed by the selection committee. The selection committee will be named by the Dean of the Asper School of Business (or designate) and will include a representative of the Manitoba Lotteries Corporation.

#### **About Lloyd LeVan Hall\***

Lloyd LeVan Hall (Van) was born and raised in Toronto, Ontario, where he entered and completed the Chartered Accountancy program. His many accomplishments included teaching at Memorial University (St. John's, Newfoundland) and designing and helping to implement the first professional accountancy program in Tanzania, while working for the Canadian University Students Overseas (CUSO), as controller of the National Development Corporation (Tanzania).

After returning to Canada and settling in Winnipeg in 1975, Van joined the Communities Economic Development Fund, a Manitoba Crown Corporation, as Treasurer and Assistant General Manager. He entered public practice in 1978 where he worked until semi-retirement in 2004. In 2003, he was elected Fellow of the Manitoba CA Institute for outstanding service to the profession and the community.

During his public practice career, Van worked very closely with numerous Aboriginal communities and organization, providing financial services and training to students. He also served on the boards of both public institutions and various not-for-profit organizations and was a volunteer for many others.

Shortly before his death, Van was named a member of the Order of the Buffalo Hunt, one of the highest honours the Province of Manitoba can bestow on individuals who demonstrate outstanding skills in the areas of leadership, service, and community commitment.
