Anesthesia

The University of Manitoba has a long history of collaboration with the Department of Anesthesia to provide Enhanced Skills training in FP- Anesthesia. This program is one year in length and encompasses training in tertiary care settings, community hospitals and rural settings. Oncology

This program provides a 6 – 12 month experience to prepare family physicians for a career in a variety of cancer treatment settings. Rotations include outpatient medical and radiation oncology clinics, a family physician-run continuity clinic in oncology, inpatient palliative care, outpatient pain and symptom management clinics, and rural oncology and palliative care. The experience can be customized to an individual's needs, with other possible rotations including surgical and psychosocial oncology, inpatient leukemia/stem cell transplant service and research.

Palliative Medicine

The Palliative Medicine residency program at the University of Manitoba was one of the first to receive joint accreditation by the CFPC and the RCPSC. The program is one year in length and encompasses inpatient, outpatient, home visitation and consultation experiences as well as exposure to oncology and rural palliative care. A scholarly project is a mandatory requirement; a research rotation with guidance is provided.
