

ISBISTER UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Donor: University of Manitoba and the Manitoba Scholarship and Bursary Initiative

Eligibility: Music student

Criteria:

- have been ranked above all competitors on the average of the grades on the subjects for which the scholarships are given (or in cases where more than one scholarship is offered, are members of a group that has been so ranked) or have become eligible through reversion;
- no Isbister Undergraduate Scholarship shall be awarded in the graduating year of any faculty or school;
- no distinction shall be made between general and honours students.
- have removed at the same examination period, or prior to it, any condition from a previous year that may have been registered against them.

Isbister Undergraduate Scholarships are to be offered to students who:

- have been ranked above all competitors on the average of the grades on the subjects for which the scholarships are given (or in cases where more than one scholarship is offered, are members of a group that has been so ranked) or have become eligible through reversion; and
- have removed at the same examination period, or prior to it, any condition from a previous year that may have been registered against them.

The scholarship is to be used in the annual session following that of the examinations at which it was won. To receive payment, the winner must be registered and in attendance at The University of Manitoba or an affiliated college upon the full work of the next succeeding year of a degree course (or, if the scholarship was awarded on the work of a year in University 1, Arts or Science which is the final year of the minimum prerequisite for entrance to another faculty (e.g., Management, Law), registration in the full work of the first year of that faculty will meet this requirement.)

* Four additional Isbister Scholarships will be awarded to University of Winnipeg nominees (2 in Arts, 2 in Science) (24341) and two to Brandon University (1 in Arts and 1 in Science) (24342).

Until the 1997-98 academic session, awards were valued at between \$150.00-\$200.00. Starting in the 1998-99 academic session, the award values were increased as additional donations have been made to the fund and the revenue on the fund grows each year. Specific award values will be set each year in accordance with available revenue.

Within the faculties and schools, Isbister Undergraduate Scholarships shall be awarded on the basis of highest related average standings irrespective of year and course, subject to the following two provisos:

- No Isbister Undergraduate Scholarship shall be awarded in the graduating year of any faculty or school;
- No distinction shall be made between general and honours students.

To ensure, so far as possible, that all Isbister Undergraduate Scholarships shall be awarded each year, a system of reversions has been established according to the following plan:

(a) Faculties and schools will be organized into four divisions as follows:

I	Arts and Science Environment Law Latin Philosophy (CUSB) Music Nursing University 1	II	Commerce Agriculture Human Ecology Physical Education Education
III	Pharmacy Fine Arts Environmental Design Social Work	IV	Engineering Medicine Dentistry Dental Hygiene Medical Rehabilitation

- (b) When a scholarship offered in any faculty or school is to go by default through lack of a qualified candidate, that scholarship will revert to the student within the same division who has the next highest related average standing to the last Isbister winner in that division.
- (c) Should there be one or more scholarships not qualified for within the division in which it is offered, it shall revert to division I.
