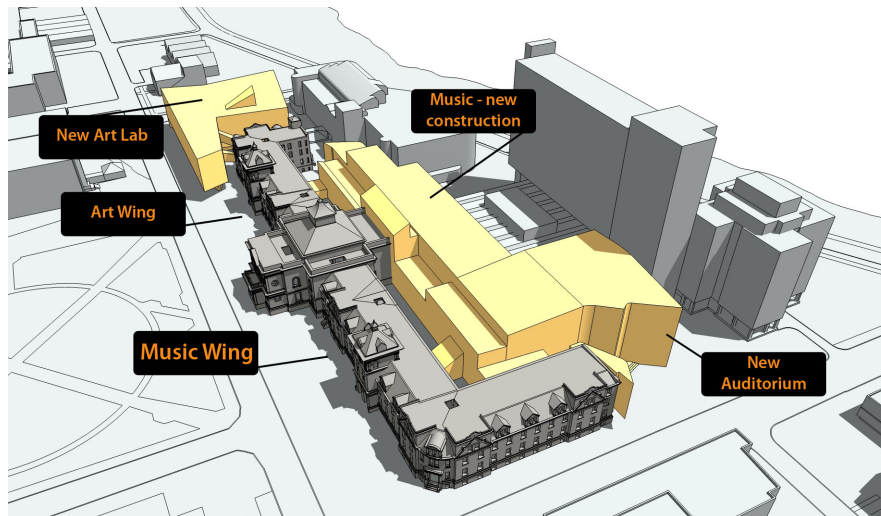


Taché Arts Project

Students can pursue an undergraduate degree in General Music, History, Performance, Composition, Jazz Studies and Integrated Music Education. We also offer a Post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Performance, and graduate degrees in Instrumental or Choral Conducting, Composition and Performance.

The diversity and breadth of music programs provide an environment where **excellence** meets **innovation** and prepares graduates for a wide range of music- and arts-related careers. There are countless opportunities for the study and performance of music both on campus and with numerous organizations in Winnipeg's vibrant musical community.
