# Report of the Senate Committee on Admissions concerning a proposal from the College of Nursing to modify the admission requirements for the Bachelor of Nursing degree program (2020.11.17)

# Preamble:

2. The College of Nursing is proposing a modification to the admission requirements for the Bachelor of Nursing degree program. The modification involves the recognition of the course name change of HMEC 2650 to FMLY 2650.

3. The proposal was approved by the College of Nursing Faculty Council on June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and was endorsed by SCADM on November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

## **Observations:**

We are seeking approval for the following fall term 2021 end date changes:

We are seeking approval to end Dentistry 1, 2, and Dental Hygiene 2 fall term clinic completion dates which currently end November 26, 2021 (exam period November 29-December 10, 2021) to a revised clinic end date of December 3, 2021 (exam period from December 6-17, 2021).

We are seeking approval to end Dentistry 3 fall term clinic end dates, which currently end 3 December, 2021 (exam period 29 November-10 December, 2021) to a revised clinic end date of December 10, 2021 (exam period from 6-17 December, 2021).

We are also seeking approval to extend the Dentistry 4, and Dental Hygiene 3 clinic completion dates from the current end date of December 3, 2021 (exam period from December 6-10, 2021) to a revised end date of December 10, 2021 (exam period from December 13-17, 2021). No other changes are anticipated at this time.

The original academic completion dates were submitted at a time when the expectation was for all clinic and pre-clinical spaces within the Dental College to be operating at full "pre-COVID" capacity by Fall Term 2021. Due to ongoing pandemic restrictions the Fall Term 2021 term will continue to function at a reduced clinical capacity and pre-clinical spacing.

Therefore, in order to help offset the clinical and pre-clinical impact of these restrictions it is requested that the Fall Term 2021 for the Dr. Gerald Niznick College of Dentistry be extended by 1 week for all undergraduate Dentistry and Dental Hygiene courses. This would be beneficial for the students to increase their clinical exposure thus advancing their knowledge and skill development.

Fall Term 2021 and Winter Term 2022 start dates will not be impacted with this change. The IDDP program term end date and exam period will remain unchanged.
