Re:	Revised Academic Schedule, Return to Teaching

On November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, Senate approved that the Senate Executive Committee in accordance with its normal powers "to deal with contingencies that arise between meetings of Senate" is empowered to approve revisions to the Academic Schedule for the Fall 2021 and Winter 2022 Terms and to approve the temporary modification or suspension of academic policies required to facilitate the completion of the Fall and Winter Terms.

On November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, Senate Executive approved on behalf of Senate two scenarios addressing revisions to the Academic Schedule; one based on a return to teaching on or before November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021, and one based on a return to teaching between November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and up to, and including, November 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021. In response to the ongoing labour disruption, a third and fourth scenario is being proposed to address a potential return to teaching after November 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021.

On behalf of the Academic and Research Team, sub-committee of the Continuity Steering Committee, attached you will find two proposed revisions to the Academic Schedule based on the following scenarios:

- i. the return of striking UMFA members to teaching between November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and, up to and including, November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021 (*Scenario 3*); and
- ii. the return of striking UMFA members to teaching between December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and, up to and including, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 (*Scenario 4*).

To maintain the integrity of our courses and programs, and to ensure requirements for accreditation, the committee continues to recommend that the number of instructional days remain at sixty-one days where at all possible.

The key differences between the attached scenarios and those presented on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 is the extension of instructional days for those courses interrupted by the strike into January 2022 and the corresponding shift of the alternate Fall Term exam period. Under Scenario 3, the Winter Term 2022 schedule remains unchanged; under Scenario 4, the Winter Term 2022 schedule requires revisions.

As a reminder, the start of Winter Term 2022 has already been delayed in response to COVID-19 and UM's planned return to more normal instructional activity in January; this delay reduces the flexibility in the Winter Term academic schedule. The late start has mitigated the strike's impact on the Winter Term thus far; should the disruption continue to December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 or beyond, there will be significant impacts on the term.

Should there be a return to teaching between December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and, up to and including, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the start of Winter Term 2022 classes would be delayed from January 17<sup>th</sup> to January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and the remaining schedule for the term would be shifted accordingly. Instructional days would be reduced to sixty days and the Winter Term break would be reduced from a four-day break (February 22<sup>nd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup>) to a one-day break (February 22<sup>nd</sup>). The Winter Term exam period would proceed as scheduled to prevent delays in the start of the Summer Term 2022 and to minimize the impact on graduation and on admission and registration timelines for the Fall Term 2022.

Accordingly, the Academic and Research Team recommends the following motion to be considered for approval by Senate Executive:

- THAT should there be a return to teaching of striking UMFA members between November 24th, 2021 and up to, and including, November 30th, 2021, the Academic Schedule revisions as presented in Scenario 3 would be implemented.
- THAT should there be a return to teaching of striking UMFA members between December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and, up to and including, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the Academic Schedule revisions as presented in Scenario 4 would be implemented.

The Academic and Research Team has recommended to the Provost and Vice-President (Academic) that under Scenario 3, the voluntary withdrawal (VW) date for the Fall Term be moved to December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, for <u>all</u> classes, continuing and interrupted. Under Scenario 4, the VW date for the Fall Term is to be moved to December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021 for continuing classes and to December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 for interrupted courses. The VW date is to be moved to February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022 for Fall/Winter Term spanned courses and to April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 for Winter Term courses. Provost approval of these changes is contingent on approval by the Senate Executive Committee of the associated changes to the Academic Schedule as presented in the attached.

Further, February 2022 graduation deadlines continue to be monitored closely; a second deadline will be identified once normal teaching resumes to accommodate any students who may have experienced delays in completing final program requirements owing to the strike. Senate will be informed of any proposed changes to the timelines of approval of the final list of graduands once more is known.

On behalf of the Continuity Steering Committee, the Academic and Research Team continues to work closely with the Office of the Registrar and Enrolment Services to model scenarios based on the potential duration of the strike, to identify the necessary revisions to the academic schedule, and to work through issues as they arise and bring forward the necessary changes for approval as required.

At a meeting on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Senate executive approved two scenarios to modify the Academic Schedule. As a result of the duration of the labour action it has become necessary to develop a third and fourth scenario. The proposed modifications apply to most University of Manitoba programs; any impact to dates for programs who are on an irregular schedule will be brought forward as needed. Further modification to these dates and other dates in the academic schedule may be required depending on the duration of the strike.

## <u>Scenario 3:</u>

The proposed changes for a scenario where striking UMFA members return to teaching between November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021, and, up to and including, November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021, are:

- Modification to the end of fall term classes: The last instructional day of fall term, December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, remains unchanged for continuing classes. The last instructional day for fall term for interrupted classes will be January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022. There will be no classes held during the University closure that is scheduled for December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021, through January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Classes will resume on January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and will conclude on January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The number of instructional days for the fall term will remain at 61 days. The number of instructional contact hours for interrupted classes will be:
  - Monday/Wednesday/Friday 37 hours (original schedule, 37 hours)
  - Tuesday/Thursday 36 teaching hours (original schedule, 36 hours)
  - Monday/Wednesday 37.5 hours (original schedule, 36 hours)
- Creation of an alternate examination period: The original exam period, December 11<sup>th</sup>- 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, will continue as is for continuing courses that are not disrupted by the strike. The dates of the alternate exam period will be January 14<sup>th</sup> 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022. All courses interrupted by the strike will have their exams re-scheduled to occur during this alternate period.

- 3. Voluntary withdrawal date: The Provost will move the voluntary withdrawal date from November 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022, to December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, for <u>all</u> classes, continuing and interrupted. This results in the VW date taking place on the last day of classes for continuing courses and the 46<sup>th</sup> day of classes for interrupted courses. From this point forward the voluntary withdrawal date for continuing courses for all scenarios will be December 10, 2021.
- Final grade appeal deadline: The final grade appeal deadline will be moved from January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022, for <u>all</u> classes, continuing and interrupted.

**Note:** Depending on the exact day of return, some minor modifications to the academic schedule may still be required. The dates in this section assume a return to teaching on November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

### <u>Scenario 4:</u>

The proposed changes for a scenario where striking UMFA members return to teaching between December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, and, up to and including, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021, are:

### For Fall 2021 term

- Modification to the end of fall term classes: The last instructional day of fall term, December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, remains unchanged for continuing classes. The last instructional day for fall term for interrupted classes will be January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. There will be no classes held during the University closure that is scheduled for December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021, through January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Classes will resume on January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and will conclude on January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The number of instructional days for the fall term will remain at 61 days. The number of instructional contact hours for interrupted classes will be:
  - Monday/Wednesday/Friday 37 hours (original schedule, 37 hours)
  - Tuesday/Thursday 36 teaching hours (original schedule, 36 hours)
  - Monday/Wednesday 37.5 hours (original schedule, 36 hours)
- Creation of an alternate examination period: The original exam period, December 11<sup>th</sup>- 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, will continue as is for continuing courses that are not disrupted by the strike. The dates of the alternate exam period will be January 21<sup>st</sup> 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022. All courses interrupted by the strike will have their exams re-scheduled to occur during this alternate period.
- Voluntary withdrawal date: The Provost will move the voluntary withdrawal date from November 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, to December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, for continuing classes. From this point forward the voluntary withdrawal date for continuing courses for all scenarios will be December 10, 2021. The voluntary withdrawal deadline for interrupted classes will move to December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021. Students will have to request voluntary withdrawals for interrupted classes through their faculty office.
- Final grade appeal deadline: The final grade appeal deadline will be moved from January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022, for <u>all</u> classes, continuing and interrupted.

#### For Winter 2022 term

- Modification to the start and end dates for winter term classes: The first instructional day for winter term 2022 classes will be moved from January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The last instructional day will be moved from April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The number of instructional days for the winter term will remain at 60 days. The number of instructional contact hours for the winter term remain unchanged:
  - Monday/Wednesday/Friday 36 hours
  - Tuesday/Thursday 36 teaching hours
  - Monday/Wednesday 37.5 hours

## 2. Modifications to registration period and revision period deadlines:

- Regular registration period (Winter and Winter/Summer spanning classes): The end date for this period will be moved from January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Registration revision period (Winter term classes): This period will move from January 17<sup>th</sup>- 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 to January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Registration revision period (Winter/Summer term spanning classes): This period will move from November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022, to November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Last date to drop without penalty (Fall/Winter classes Part B, Winter classes, Winter/Summer spanning classes): This deadline will move from January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Last date to register (Winter and Winter/Summer spanning classes): This deadline will move from January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022, to February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022.
- Voluntary withdrawal date: The Provost will move the voluntary withdrawal date for the winter term from March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, and from January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022, to February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022, for fall/winter term spanning courses.
- Reduction of the winter term break: The winter term break will be reduced from a four-day break originally scheduled from February 22<sup>nd</sup> 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022 to a one-day break, February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022. The University is closed with no classes taking place on Monday February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022, in observance of the Louis Riel holiday.

#### Notes:

- i. Depending on the exact day of return, some minor modifications to the academic schedule may still be required. The dates in this section assume a return to teaching on December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021.
- ii. The dates for the winter term examination period, April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022 May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, remain unchanged.

On November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, Senate approved that section 2.6 of the Voluntary Withdrawal policy for the Fall 2021 Term be suspended and that the Provost be authorized to amend the Voluntary Withdrawal date for the Fall 2021 and Winter 2022 Terms, if required and report thereon to Senate.

On November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021, Senate Executive approved on behalf of Senate a revised academic schedule based on a return to teaching between November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and up to, and including, November 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021. Associated with the revised schedule, is a proposed amendment of the voluntary withdrawal deadline for the Fall 2021 term from November 23<sup>rd</sup> to December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

As the UMFA labour action continues, please accept this memo as confirmation of my approval to amend the VW date for the Fall 2021 Term to December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021. I would request that your office proceed accordingly.
