The Faculty of Graduate Studies proposes the introduction of an M.Sc. in Management program to be offered by the I.H. Asper School of Business. This graduate program will prepare students for further study and research at the doctoral level and allow for research specialization in a way that the M.B.A. program does not.

Professor Stimpson suggested that the comment regarding students with minors in management being eligible for admission be moved in to the admission section of the proposal. Dr. Smith agreed to the suggestion.

Dean Percival advised that the Senate Executive Committee endorses the report to Senate.

3. Proposal to Establish a Research Chair In Orthopaedic Surgery

Page 121

Section 2.1 of Policy 428 "Chairs and Professorships" outlines the steps to be followed in the establishment of Chairs or Professorships. In accordance with that policy, the Senate Committee on University Research is recommending the establishment of a Research Chair in Orthopaedic Surgery. The proposal was developed by the Faculty of Medicine.

This Chair will "provide for leadership, scholarship and mentorship in the development of clinical research as well as strengthen collaborative academic ventures in the Faculty of Medicine."

The Chair will be funded through investment income from an endowment that is held by the Winnipeg Foundation.

The proposal has the support of the Dean of Medicine, the Vice-Presidents (Academic) and (Research) and was endorsed by the Senate Committee on University Research at its March 12, 2003 meeting.

Dean Percival advised that the Senate Executive Committee endorses the report to

Senate.

It was MOVED by Dr. Jayas, on behalf of the Committee: THAT Senate approve and recommend that the Board of Governors approve the establishment of a Chair in Orthopaedic Surgery [as recommended in the report of the Senate Committee on University Research dated April 11, 2003].

4. Report of the Senate Committee on University Reserach
re: a Periodic Review of the Centre on Aging Page 125

The Senate Committee on University Research is charged under Policy 1405 to conduct periodic reviews of Research Centres and Institutes not less than once every five years. The Committee conducted a review of the Centre on Aging and recommends that the Centre continue for a five year period beginning July 1, 2003.

Dean Percival advised that the Senate Executive Committee endorses the report to Senate.

It was MOVED by Dr. Jayas, on behalf of the Committee, THAT Senate approve the continuation of the Centre on Aging for a five year term beginning July 1, 2003 [as endorsed by the Senate Committee on University Research in its report dated March 12, 2003].

5. Report of the Senate Committee on Appeals

Since last reporting to Senate, the Senate Committee on Appeals considered 2 appeals.

The first of these was heard on December 20, 2002 and was an appeal against the decision of the Faculty of Dentistry not to increase the appellant's final grade in a clinical course (102.309) by 5%. This 5% corresponded to a penalty for not completing the work on time. The student had requested and received an extension due to a medical disability and there was a concern about whether or not the extension had been taken into consideration.

The Committee felt that it could not make a decision regarding the remedy that was sought by the Appellant since, in the Committee's view, this required an academic judgement to be made, which is outside its jurisdiction.

However, the Committee found that there was a miscommunication by both parties regarding the two week extension for this course 102.309. The Committee felt that the granting of the two week extension by the Faculty of Dentistry moved the course completion date to the end of the Completion Clinic for course 102.309.

Senate May 14, 2003

Therefore, the Committee directed the Faculty of Dentistry to re-evaluate the Appellant's grade for course 102.309 as of the end of the Completion Clinic.

The second appeal, which was heard on January 30, 2003, was against a Faculty of Education decision debarring the appellant from two courses (63.402 and 81.402) during the 2001-2002 regular session. The ground cited were extenuating personal circumstances and undue hardship. This appeal was denied.
