Dean Whitmore spoke of the passing of Dr. Valdimarsson as a friend and colleague in his prime who will be remembered both personally and professionally for his thoughtfulness and insight.

Professor Judy Anderson spoke of Dr. Valdimarsson noting that he received his Bachelor and Master's degree from the University of Manitoba and received his Ph.D. in Zoology from the University of Western Ontario. Dr. Valdimarsson became an Assistant Professor at Queen's University and, in 1998, returned to Winnipeg with his partner Lorna Jakobson, to become an Assistant Professor at the University of Manitoba.

Ms. Gottheil reported that there is currently a CPR requirement for admission and registration to the athletic therapy undergraduate program. This proposal requires students to obtain the more advanced Health Care Provider CPR Certification which is a requirement for certification in athletic therapy.

2. Reports of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation

a) RE: Use of 'discipline' grade comment and Use of 'Comments' Function on Student History Page 23

Dr. Grant reported that these proposals arose from a sub-committee of the Associate Dean Undergraduate/University Liaison Officer (ADU/ULO) group established by the Provost. Dr. Lynn Smith reported on the discussions of the sub-committee which was set up to provide resources to disciplinary authorities including templates of letters, flowcharts, a website and a link to advocacy material.

The changes proposed include replacing the grade comment *CW* (compulsory withdrawal) with "*discipline*" to be attached to a grade and accompanied by a transcript notation. Mr. Marnoch provided a visual representation of the proposal to Senate which was projected on the screens (copy attached to minutes). Regarding the use of the student history, Mr. Marnoch indicated that there are two text boxes: the first displays notations for the official transcript, the second text box could include explanatory notes

such as former notations which have expired and been removed from the transcript; thus allowing staff to access this information for tracking purposes.

Professor John Anderson, Acting Chair, University Discipline Committee, expressed concerns about the compulsory time limit for the discipline notation. Dr. Grant confirmed that the time limit indicated could be indefinite.

Mr. Marnoch confirmed that the student would be informed of the process for requesting removal of the comment through the letter from the disciplinary authority informing the student of the action. The question was raised as to whether all information on the issue would be removed once the transcript notation was removed. Mr. Marnoch confirmed that, while the notation would be removed from the current transcript, there would be no change made to the student history. Dr. Smith added that any documents in the student's paper file would also remain as an historical record.

Dr. Grant MOVED, on behalf of the Committee, THAT Senate approve the Report of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation [dated June 10, 2010] regarding the use of the 'discipline' grade comment and the use of the 'comments' function on student history.
