Professor McMillan reported that Senate Executive had met on December 14, 2011. The comments of the committee accompany the reports on which they were made.

2. Report of the Senate Planning and Priorities Committee

Ms. Ducas informed members that the Senate Planning and Priorities Committee continues to consider two program proposals; the Community Recreation and Active Living program, from the Faculty of Kinesiology and Recreation Management, and the Internationally Educated Agrologists program from the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences.

1. Report of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation RE: Amendments to the Academic Regulations of the Marcel A. <u>Desautels Faculty of Music [November 24, 2011]</u> Page 18

Professor Etcheverry reported that the Marcel A. Desautels Faculty of Music is proposing to move from the use of the term grade point average to a sessional grade point average when assessing students' scholastic progress. She referred members to the proposal for an explanation of the rationale for, and the expected outcomes of, the proposed change.

Professor Etcheverry MOVED, on behalf of the committee, THAT Senate approve the Report of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation regarding Amendments to the Academic Regulations of the Marcel A. Desautels Faculty of Music [dated November 24, 2011].

2. Report of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation Page 21 RE: Amendment to the Unsafe Clinical Practice Policy, Faculty of Nursing [November 24, 2011]

Professor Etcheverry informed members that the Faculty of Nursing is proposing changes to its Unsafe Clinical Practice Policy. She noted that the language used

in the document has been revised so it is consistent with that used in the Manitoba Workplace Safety and Health Act. The revisions also take into account that persons present with students in clinical placements sometimes experience adverse effects as a result of unsafe clinical practice by students.

Professor Etcheverry MOVED, on behalf of the committee, THAT Senate approve the Report of the Senate Committee on Instruction and Evaluation regarding an Amendment to the Unsafe Clinical Practice Policy, Faculty of Nursing [dated November 24, 2011].

Professor Judy Anderson noted that other students might also be adversely affected by unsafe clinical practices, particularly if students sometimes work in groups. She suggested, as a friendly amendment, that the policy be revised to acknowledge this potential risk. Professor Etcheverry replied that the Committee had not discussed this possibility. She noted that the Faculty's rationale for the revised policy refers to adverse impacts on the healthcare team and suggested that other students might be understood to be part of that team.

Dean Crooks indicated that the Faculty of Nursing would support the proposed change. Professor Etcheverry agreed to the change as a friendly amendment.

3. Report of the Senate Committee on Rules and Procedures Regarding the Addition of the Executive Lead, Indigenous Achievement, as an Assessor on Senate [November 25, 2011]

Dr. Doering reported that, notwithstanding the number of assessors currently on Senate, which stands at seventeen, the Senate Committee on Rules and Procedures recognized that there is a compelling argument to add the Executive Lead, Indigenous Achievement as an assessor.

Dr. Doering MOVED, on behalf of the committee, THAT Senate approve the Report of the Senate Committee on Rules and Procedures regarding the addition of the Executive Lead, Indigenous Achievement, as an assessor on Senate [dated November 25, 2011].

XII ADDITIONAL BUSINESS

1. Request from President for Senate to Nominate Karen Adams Page 25 to the Public Library Advisory Board

Mr. Leclerc advised members that the Minister of Culture, Heritage, and Tourism had requested that Senate nominate an individual to serve on the Public Library Advisory Board. The Minister intends to reconstitute the board, which has been dormant for a number of years. The President has consulted with the University Librarian and Ms. Adams has agreed to let her name stand should Senate endorse the nomination.

Dean Turnbull MOVED, seconded by Dean Whitmore, THAT Senate approve the nomination of Karen Adams, University Librarian, to serve as the representative of the University of Manitoba on the Public Library Advisory Board of the Province of Manitoba.

2. Senate Motion on Academic Amnesty for February 1, 2012

Page 26

Ms. Rashid informed Senate that UMSU has called for a Day of Action on February 1, 2012, to raise awareness of student issues and to lobby the provincial government to increase funding to the University. She asked, on behalf of UMSU, that Senate approve a motion for academic amnesty on that day, to support and encourage student participation on that day. She noted that support of the motion would not absolve students of their academic responsibilities on that day. Rather, students and faculty would be encouraged to make alternative arrangements.

Ms Tapp MOVED, seconded by Professor Eskin, THAT Senate approve the motion on the February 1, 2012 UMSU Day of Action.

To more adequately reflect UMSU's goals for the Day of Action, Ms. Enns proposed that the first clause of the Senate motion on academic amnesty be revised to read: "Be it resolved that February 1st, 2012 be recognized as a day of student action toward quality and accessible education and that all academic staff shall be made aware of this fact."

Ms. Enns MOVED, seconded by Professor Guard, THAT the first clause of the Senate motion on academic amnesty for February 1, 2012 be amended as set out above.

CARRIED

Ms. Enns called for the second clause in the Senate motion to be revised to read: "Be it further resolved that students are expected to fulfill all their academic responsibilities regardless of the participation on February 1st, 2012, and that students and instructors be encouraged to make reasonable accommodations for any conflicts in advance of the day."

Ms. Enns MOVED, seconded by Professor Chen, THAT the second clause of the Senate motion on academic amnesty for February 1, 2012 be amended as set out in the preceding paragraph.

Dean Whitmore asked Ms. Enns to explain the difference in meaning between the original and revised wording for the second clause. Ms. Enns replied that the revised wording is consistent with language used for issues concerning freedom of speech and human rights and that it puts the onus on people to provide justification for either making or not making alternative arrangements.

Professor Judy Anderson asked if it would be problematic if the phrase 'where possible' were to be retained in the clause. Ms. Enns suggested that this is encompassed in the word 'reasonable' as it describes 'accommodations.'

Professor John Anderson argued that the phrase 'where possible' should be retained. He noted that course outlines have already been distributed for the current term. He suggested that the course outlines effectively serve as a contract between instructors and students. Given that course outlines sometimes specify dates on which particular assignments are to occur or be completed, it might not always be possible to make alternate arrangements. Professor Guard countered that the revised wording is clear that students are expected to fulfill their academic responsibilities on February 1st, regardless of their participation. It also makes a strong statement that faculty and students should find ways to accommodate students' participation. She argued that Senate should support the motion to show support for a student activity that is of interest to the University generally, with respect to making a statement about the need for adequate funding for the institution.

The Chair called for a vote on the motion to amend the second clause of the Senate motion on academic amnesty for February 1st, 2012.

MOTION CARRIED

The University Secretary read aloud the revised wording for both clauses in the Senate motion.

The Chair called for a vote on the main motion, as amended.

MOTION CARRIED

Dean Whitmore suggested that, in future years, UMSU provide Senate with earlier notice of the Day of Action to allow faculty members time to prepare and plan accordingly.

XIII ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m.
