V <u>REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT</u>

President Barnard welcomed members back to the beginning of another academic year. He remarked on a number of things that will engage the University community in the year ahead, including revising the Strategic Planning Framework and Strategic Research Plan, and budget challenges. The President reported that changes in provincial administration are unfolding slowly following the recent dissolution of the Council on Post-Secondary Education (COPSE). He said the University would be involved in discussions with the Minister of Education and Advanced Learning and those previously involved in COPSE regarding future mandates for universities. President Barnard said the federal government had announced the Canada First Research Excellence Fund (CFREF) in the spring. Administration and application processes for the funding are being developed following consultations with universities through the summer. He said universities would also actively advocate for support for increases in Tri-Council grants in the next cycle.

President Barnard said the Council of Presidents of Universities of Manitoba includes several new members, including Senator Csepregi, President of the Université de Saint-Boniface. He said the Council is optimistic regarding the potential for collaboration among member institutions.

President Barnard reported that there would be announcements about the capital campaign, which is moving ahead well, in the fall and over the coming year. He noted that the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, with which the University has an active partnership, will officially open this fall, and that the recently established Faculty of Health Sciences would hold its first Faculty Council meeting on September 18th.
