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2. <u>In Memoriam: Prof. Albert Oliver Ridley</u>

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Dean Wittenberg offered a memorial tribute for Professor Albert Oliver Ridley, who had been a member of the Department of Soil Science, Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences, beginning in 1958 until his retirement in 1995. She remembered Professor Ridley for his contributions to teaching and to applied research in soil fertility and fertilizer management and soil management and conservation, both in the province and internationally.

3. <u>In Memoriam: Dr. Robert J. Soper</u>

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Dean Wittenberg paid tribute to Professor Emeritus Robert Soper, who was a member of the Department of Soil Science, Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences, from 1958 to 1991. Professor Soper was recognized internationally for his research contributions in the areas of crop nutrition, soil testing, and fertilizers, including the development and use of radioactive phosphorous in crop nutrition studies and in the use of stable isotope-labelled nitrogen to test nitrogen dynamics in soil and biological nitrogen fixation in legumes.

4. <u>In Memoriam: Dr. Kenneth Wayne Taylor</u>

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Acting Dean Hoppa honoured Dr. Kenneth Wayne Taylor, a member of the Department of Sociology, Faculty of Arts, from 1969 – 2012. Professor Taylor will be remembered for his contributions to teaching in the Department, particularly graduate teaching, and to research in diverse areas, including workplace sexual harassment, racism in Canadian immigration policy, the theory and practice of social science research, and self-administered home care for persons with disabilities.

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IV REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

Dr. Barnard asked Senators to remember that, whatever position individuals might hold in the current UMFA strike, members of the University are colleagues who collectively bear the burden of maintaining the institution and its processes as negotiations to resolve the matter continue. He reported that representatives of the Administration and UMFA were involved in a conciliation process and were meeting again that day. He observed that everyone involved needed to be concerned about the impact of the situation on the students' semester and that it would be important to have good plans in place to move forward following a resolution.

Dr. Barnard reported that the Operational Continuity Committee was meeting daily. It had established an Academic Sub-Committee, Chaired by Dean Halden. The Sub-Committee was working with Deans and offices across the University to understand the impacts of the strike and to prepare recommendations for Senate Executive and Senate's consideration with respect to academic matters, including the dates of term, Voluntary Withdrawal deadlines, and issues related to examinations.

Dean Halden said the Academic Sub-Committee had met a number of times and had developed responses to frequently asked questions (FAQs) that had been posted to a webpage with strike information. The Sub-Committee would be focusing on future-planning in the coming days, to develop recommendations to be brought to Senate.

Observing that universities encourage critical thinking and the current situation was a complicated one, Dr. Barnard called upon members of the University community to exercise this skill, as, he remarked, it is rare that the truth about a complex situation can be represented by any one view or any one speaker. He said the strike was a difficult situation for the University, and it would be important for people to think about how the community would want to behave as an institution.

Membership of the Faculty Council and the Faculty Executive Council would be amended to include a librarian. Quorum for Faculty Council would be changed from one hundred members to sixty members.

Dr. Doering MOVED, on behalf of the committee, THAT Senate approve the Report of the Senate Committee on Rules and Procedures concerning revisions to the Rady Faculty of Health Sciences Council Bylaw, effective upon Senate approval.
