The College of Occupational Therapists of Manitoba, a member of the Association of Canadian Occupational Therapy Regulatory Organizations, registers occupational therapists in Manitoba who meet established education and practice standards as outlined in the Essential Competencies of Practice for Occupational Therapists in Canada.
