Fall Term Enrolment (as at November 1)

Summary Report

November 9, 2022

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, comparisons to other years should be made with caution as figures may not be comparable. Enrolments and credit hours during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic were higher than pre-pandemic levels. In 2022, as pandemic restrictions have eased, enrolments and credit hours have returned to pre-pandemic levels.

Comparison to Pre-Pandemic Term

Fall Term 2022 represents a 1.5% decrease in enrolment, compared to Fall Term 2019, with 30,290 students in Fall Term 2019 and 29,844 students in Fall Term 2022.

Undergraduate credit hours represent a 1.0% decrease compared to Fall Term 2019, with 270,605 credit hours in Fall Term 2019 and 267,811 credit hours in Fall Term 2022

Fall Term Enrolment

As at the official reporting date of November 1, overall enrolment at the University of Manitoba decreased from 31,037 students in Fall Term 2021 to 29,844 students in Fall Term 2022. The decline in enrolment in Fall Term 2022 was due mainly to a decrease in the number of part-time students. Full-time enrolment decreased from 25,967 students to 25,661 students; part-time enrolment decreased from 5,070 students to 4,183 students.

Undergraduate enrolment decreased from 26,412 students in Fall Term 2021 to 25,244 students in Fall Term 2022. Graduate enrolment decreased from 3,931 students last year to 3,914 students this year.

Total undergraduate credit hours decreased from 275,585 credit hours in Fall Term 2021 to 267,811 credit hours in Fall Term 2022. Distance and Online Education credit hours, excluding remote-learning, increased from 31,974 to 33,600 credit hours in Fall Term 2022.

International enrolment decreased from 6,788 students last year to 6,601 students this year. As percentages of the student body, international students make up 20.5% of undergraduate students, 35.6% of graduate students, and 22.1% of the overall student population.

Self-declared Canadian Indigenous enrolment increased from 2,614 students last year to 2,625 students this year. Indigenous students currently make up 9.3% of undergraduate students, 6.3% of graduate students, and 8.8% of the overall student population.
