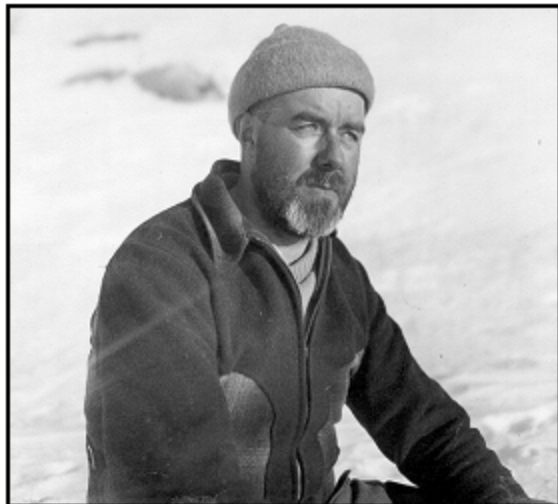


# Dr. Andrew Taylor Northern Studies Award and Research Grant

## The Dr. Andrew Taylor Northern Studies Award and Research Grant Program

---

The University of Manitoba Archives & Special Collections offers each **even** numbered year an award of \$1,000 to a student who:

- (1) is enrolled full or part-time in a graduate program at the University of Manitoba;
- (2) has achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average on all courses completed to date of at least 3.0;
- (3) is conducting, or has proposed to conduct, research on some aspect of Northern Canada; and
- (4) has presented a research proposal with the most value and promise in the area of Northern Canadian Studies, as deemed by the selection committee.

In **odd** numbered years, the Archives provides a grant of \$1,000.00 to a scholar or student whose research project shows academic merit in the opinion of the Selection Committee and who:

- (1) employs the Andrew Taylor Collection for research purposes; or
- (2) employs the Andrew Taylor Collection to promote the collection; or
- (3) employs other materials relating to polar regions held in Archives & Special Collections for research; or
- (4) employs other materials relating to polar regions held in Archives & Special Collections to promote the collections.

Projects that promote either the Andrew Taylor Collection or other polar materials in the Archives would include digitization projects, publication programs, and so on.

The grant is available for reimbursement of transportation, subsistence, and related research costs. The program does not cover tuition payments.

The award and research grant are funded by the Andrew Taylor Fund. Dr. Andrew Taylor (1907-1993) graduated from the University of Manitoba in 1931 with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering and received an honorary doctorate from the University in 1991 in celebration of his outstanding achievements as a national civil engineer, geographer, and historian. Among his many endeavours, Dr. Taylor led a British Army research team in Antarctica and served as consultant to the U.S. Corps of Engineers in the Canadian Arctic. One of his great achievements was to produce a comprehensive index of the Arctic Blue Books, now available at: <http://www.umanitoba.ca/libraries/archives/arcticbb/>. Dr. Taylor received the Order of Canada in 1986 in recognition of his work. Upon his retirement, Dr. Taylor opened an antiquarian book shop in Winnipeg, focused on polar regions and western Canadiana.

## Terms and Conditions

It is understood and agreed that the recipient of an award or grant in this program ("the Recipient") is a recipient and not as such an employee of the University.

The Recipient agrees to submit to the University of Manitoba, when the research/project is completed, a report of the results accomplished. If the research/project is not completed within a year, the applicant should inform the University of Manitoba and indicate when the project is likely to be completed.

The Recipient agrees to perform the research/project as specified in the original application, or with the Selection Committee's agreement.

The Recipient agrees that apparatus or materials of lasting value purchased by a grant from the University of Manitoba shall not be disposed of after completion of the investigation, except after consultation with the University of Manitoba and in accord with its wishes.

The Recipient agrees that any publication of the results of the work supported in whole or in part by a grant from the University of Manitoba shall state in the acknowledgements, preface, or footnotes, that the work was aided by a Dr. Andrew Taylor Northern Studies and Research Grant from the University of Manitoba.

The Recipient agrees that a complimentary copy of a final printed work supported by the grant shall be forwarded to the University of Manitoba.

In the event that the recipient of an award/grant shall fail to commence in a reasonable time and thereafter to continue to work on the project for which the grant was made, the University shall be under no obligation to make any payment, or, if any has been made, to make any further payments.

The Research Grant will be paid to the recipient upon the completion of his/her research visit to the Archives.

***Submissions will be accepted throughout the year. The award will be made in even numbered years, while the grant will be made in odd numbered years.***
