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# **LEARNING OBJECTIVES (CanMEDS)**

# **Medical Expert**

As Medical Experts, physicians integrate all of the CanMEDS Roles, applying medical knowledge, clinical skills and professional attitudes in their provision of patient-centered care.

- Understand diagnostic and treatment approaches for patients presenting with common antepartum problems (abdominal pain, cystitis, vaginitis, antepartum bleeding, threatened premature labour, musculoskeletal pain, etc.).
- Participate in intrapartum care and perform normal deliveries under supervision while minimizing discomfort to the patient.
- Participate in the care of post partum patients including management of postpartum hemorrhage, infections, contraceptive counseling and breastfeeding support.

#### Communicator

Physicians effectively facilitate the doctor-patient relationship and the dynamic exchanges that occur before, during, and after the medical encounter.

- Take a skillful, focused history using both open-ended and directed questions.
- Inform patients about their findings, diagnoses and interventions using language that is respectful of and appropriate for their level of understanding.

#### Collaborator

Physicians effectively work within a healthcare team to achieve optimal patient care.

- Interact with all members of the health care team in a respectful, inclusive manner, acknowledging the value of the team approach in optimal patient care.
- Develop an awareness of one's own limitations and seek timely assistance/consultation/referral when appropriate.

#### Leader

Physicians engage with others to contribute to a vision of a high-quality health care system and take responsibility for the delivery of excellent patient care through their activities as clinicians, administrators, scholars, or teachers.

• Develop an understanding of the life/work balance, practice management, administrative responsibilities, and remuneration available in obstetrical practice.

# **Health Advocate**

Physicians responsibly use their expertise and influence to advance the health and well-being of individual patients, communities and populations.

- Recognize the social determinants of health and take these into account when recommending diagnostic and treatment approaches.
- Advocate for culturally competent, patient-centered care for each patient in your care.

# Scholar

Physicians demonstrate a lifelong commitment to reflective learning, as well as the creation, dissemination, application and translation of medical knowledge.

- Practice evidence-based medicine. Use on-line resources to enhance patient care.
- Teach others. Engage in active discussion regarding alternative approaches based on the available evidence.

# **Professional**

As Professionals, physicians are committed to the health and well-being of individuals and society through ethical practice, profession-Led regulation, and high personal standards of behaviour.

- Develop the habit of life-long learning and commitment to excellence in the practice of medicine.
- Demonstrate a high level of ethical, honest, professional behaviour both inside and outside the clinical environment.

- Each elective student will be assigned to a consultant obstetrician and expected to be available to attend clinics, surgeries and on-call activities with that preceptor.
- Students should contact their assigned preceptor well in advance of the elective to arrange their schedules and discuss their personal learning objectives.
- University of Manitoba students should identify the meeting place for the first day of the elective.
- Visiting elective students should report to the St. Boniface Hospital or Women's Hospital Senior Administrative Resident (SAR) on Obstetrics for sign-over rounds at 0700 on the first day of the elective.
- After rounds and orientation, visiting students must obtain photo identification, activated swipe cards and verification of compliance with the Manitoba Personal Health Information Act (PHIA).
