OVERVIEW

Students attend Psychiatry grand rounds and cross program academic rounds each week.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES (CanMEDS)

<u>Medical Expert</u> – As Medical Experts, physicians integrate all of the CanMEDS Roles, applying medical knowledge, clinical skills and professional attitudes in their provision of patient-centered care.

- Assess medical and surgical inpatients with regards to common psychiatric conditions including;

 - Substance Use disorders

- To demonstrate a professional, caring and empathic style of interaction with patients
- Demonstrate an ability to relay information to patients and the treatment team in a complete yet concise fashion

<u>Collaborator</u> – Physicians effectively work within a healthcare team to achieve optimal patient care.

- To demonstrate an ability to work with a multidisciplinary team of care givers
- Teach medical and surgical colleagues about various psychiatric aspects of the care of medical patients

<u>Manager</u> – Physicians are integral participants in healthcare organizations, organizing sustainable practices, making decisions about allocating resources, and contributing to the effectiveness of the healthcare system.

- Effectively manage time to attend to the many day to day responsibilities of the CL service
- Demonstrate effectiveness in achieving a balance between personal and professional responsibilities

<u>Health Advocate</u> – Physicians responsibly use their expertise and influence to advance the health and well-being of individual patients, communities and populations.

 To be aware of the many varying aspects of patients heath and to address these issues with patients and the health care team

<u>Scholar</u> – Physicians demonstrate a lifelong commitment to reflective learning, as well as the creation, dissemination, application and translation of medical knowledge.

- Be able to write clear and concise consultation reports
- Be able to efficiently and completely assess medical patients with respect to psychiatric problems
