Eligibility

College of pharmacy undergraduate students.

Submission deadline

May 30 annually

Criteria

Each year, beginning in 2020-2021, one award of \$500 will be offered to an undergraduate student.

Beginning in 2021-2022, the award will be offered to a student who:

- has completed the second year and is registered full-time (minimum 80% course load) in the next ensuing year of study in the degree program in the College of Pharmacy at the University of Manitoba;
- has shown qualities that Rusty was well-known and respected for: compassion and friendliness to others; volunteerism; and dedication to a cause.
