

CoRS PROGRAMS

Bachelor of Respiratory Therapy (BRT)

The BRT program is an advanced-entry undergraduate program. Students participate in an integrated program of academic and clinical experiences over a 3-year period.

Master of Occupational Therapy (MOT) Program

The Master of Occupational Therapy regular program is an entry-level professional program. The program is offered to students who have a previous degree and who have completed specified prerequisite studies or their equivalents. The curriculum consists of an integration of academic and fieldwork components leading to the MOT degree.

Master of Occupational Therapy Accelerated Program

The Master of Occupational Therapy Accelerated program is for occupational therapists who have a B.M.R. (OT) degree or equivalent, have completed specified prerequisite studies, and evidence of having passed the Canadian Association of Occupational Therapists Certification Exam and/or eligibility for registration in Manitoba by the College of Occupational Therapists of Manitoba. The curriculum consists of 12 credit hours of academic course work from the MOT program or equivalent; six of these credit hours are to be OT 7750 Independent Study or equivalent. Admission to the program is dependent on the resources available in any given year.

Master of Physical Therapy (MPT) Program

The Master of Physical Therapy program is an entry-level professional program. The program will be offered to students who have a previous degree and who have completed specified prerequisite studies or their equivalents. The curriculum consists of an integration of academic and clinical education components leading to the MPT degree.

Master of Science (Rehabilitation) (M.Sc. Rehab) Program

CoRS offers a Master of Science degree in Rehabilitation, which is typically a two-year program of study requiring the completion of twelve credit hours of coursework and a research-based thesis. Reduced credit hour requirements are available for those applying who already hold a masters level professional degree (e.g., MOT, MPT).
