## **BIKE SECURITY**

- Park your bike at a designated bike rack on campus
- Place the U-lock around the frame and attach it directly to the bike rack
- For additional security use a cable to secure the front and rear wheels as well as the fork.
- Take anything easily removable like lights, cyclometers and seat bags with you when you leave

## **MOBILE DEVICE THEFT**

Security Services has introduced a new theft education program in order to try and educate the university community before they become a victim of a mobile device theft.

All Security Services staff will be leaving Theft Education cards on any unattended belongings that are found during their regular patrols. These cards are intended as a reminder that your expensive mobile devices are not always safe when they are left unattended.





## SILENT OBSERVER

Silent Observer is an anonymous reporting system put in place by Security Services. It allows anybody to anonymously notify on duty security professionals about an incident that has happened.

If you see any kind of suspicious activity or would like to report a crime to Security Services, you can submit your information online and remain anonymous.

## **RED PHONE / CODE BLUE**

These emergency phones have been placed in key locations around the university. They can easily be identified

by their bright red color and can be found indoors. Alternatively, Code Blue poles can be found outdoors in parking lots and along walkways. They can be identified by the blue light

that shines at the top of the black pole which is approximately 8 feet tall.

Both of these types of phones provide a direct link to Security Services in the case of an emergency. If at any time you need assistance or do not feel safe, press the button on one of these phones and notify the Security Services dispatcher.

#### **SUSPICIOUS**

Safe Walk and Safe Ride is a free service in which Security Services staff will meet you and walk you or give a ride to/from your car, your class, your residence room, or a bus stop. If you don't feel comfortable walking on campus at night, Security Services would be happy to assist you.
