COVID-19 SCAMS

Security Services would like to remind you to stay vigilant during these difficult times. The Canadian government website lists some COVID-19 scams that have been reported, ranging widely from door-to-door salespeople selling disinfecting products to private companies offering health services.

The website warns that we should be extra careful with unsolicited calls and texts, fake charities asking for money and people selling vaccines or health products. You should never give out personal or financial information to unsolicited contacts.

The Canadian Anti-fraud Centre announced that since March 6, 2020 - April 30, 2021, it has received 19,570 reports fraud linked to the virus. The majority of those reports are either merchandise or phishing scams.

For example: "The CAFC has been receiving reports in which the suspects have claimed to be with Red Cross offering free masks. In order to receive the masks, consumers are advised that they are required to pay the shipping fee."

The government's website explains that its own resources, and information put out by the World Health Organization, are the most reliable sources amid the pandemic.
