Safety Tips for Living and/or Working on Campus

PERSONAL SAFETY

- » When walking, appear confident and always be aware of your surroundings.
- » Plan to use the safest and most direct route when traveling to your destination.
- » Walk in a well-lit area / avoid isolated areas.
- » Do not carry an excessive amount of cash and ensure your personal belongings are always close to you.
- » Use the buddy system when coming to or leaving the campus, if possible.
- » Call Security Services for a safewalk 24/7.



Residence Safety

- » Do not leave your door unlocked at any time, even when inside.
- » Do not loan out your keys to anyone, including friends.
- » Do not open the exterior doors for anyone you do not recognize as a resident.
- » Plan laundry times with a friend.
- » Do not leave valuables lying around, record serial numbers of electronics and keep in a safe place.
- » Avoid leaving drinks unattended and do not accept drinks you did not see being prepared.



Office Safety

- » Never prop open doors
- Do not leave your office unlocked when unattended and lock your office if working alone late.
- » Do not leave keys or valuables lying around. Lock up any valuables in a drawer.
- » Record serial numbers of electronics and keep in a safe place for reporting to police.
- » Never give out personal information .
- » You know the fire plan, but what is your crisis management plan? Be informed.
