

Required Textbook

Course Description

This course directly responds to the grammatical errors that prevent effective written communication on both the sentence and paragraph level. At the start of the course, the instructor will assess a sample of each student's written work (diagnostic writing sample). The findings from this assessment will determine the grammatical functions covered in the course. This responsive syllabus prioritizes error types and focuses on the grammatical errors that most seriously affect clear communication of ideas. Developing skills for identifying errors and self-editing will be regular features of the class. Students will be encouraged to discuss specific grammatical concerns and challenges with the instructor.

Course Objectives

Students who successfully complete this course will be able to:

- Identify and self-edit for high priority grammar errors.
- Address global errors in order to improve communication.
