KEY DATES

Start your studies on your own schedule. The Bachelor of Nursing program offers three intakes: Fall, Winter and Summer. That means you can begin your program when the time is right for you.

Applicant must be eligible for admission	May 1	September 1	January 1
Transcripts to Admissions Office	June 1	October 1	January 15

* With the exception of CPR, due June 1 for Summer entry.

Effective Fall 2022, the Bachelor of Nursing program will be delivered using a three consecutive term model. Students will attend classes in each of Fall, Winter and Summer Terms. Students will go on to complete the required 97 credit hours in seven terms over a 28-month period.

ADMISSION

As an Advance Entry program, admission is based on the completion of required coursework and an adjusted grade point average (AGPA).

PROVISIONAL ACCEPTANCE

Successful applicants are required to submit Non-Academic Admission Requirements documentation. Acceptance to the program is provisional until completion and submission of these items. Admission will be revoked if all requirements are not met and all documents are not submitted to the College of Nursing by deadlines indicated.

PROFESSIONAL DESIGNATION

A graduate of the Bachelor of Nursing program must write the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) to become eligible to practice nursing. Completion of the program entitles students to work as graduate nurses and to write the NCLEX-RN to obtain the designation, Registered Nurse (RN).
