USEFUL TIP: To Order Textbooks

The Fort Garry bookstore is now open for in-person shopping. You can also order your textbooks online and pick them up in person by selecting "*Pick Up at Store*" during checkout.

- Debit cards are not accepted for online payments at this time.
- Though it takes a little longer to process than orders received through 'online', the bookstore also takes purchase orders over the phone (204-474-8321) or by email (bookstore webmaster@umanitoba.ca).

The steps:

- 1) Go to the UM online textbook order page http://bookstore.umanitoba.ca/SelectTermDept
- **2)** Type the 13-digit book number (**ISBN**) of the textbook you would like to purchase in the "*Search for book*" slot and hit ENTER. You can also type the **title** of the book but searching by using the ISBN left no room for errors as it produces the required **edition** of the textbook.

- 4) You may also have the option to buy a new or used textbook. Used books are cheaper, but they run out of stock very quickly. Order your copy as early as possible. Read more about used textbook FAQ's here

USEFUL TIP: Hold Lockers

There is a contactless physical material pickup process that UM Libraries introduced to enable students **to borrow** books (and other items) during the pandemic.

Follow these steps to place a **'request'** online:

- 1) Use Library Search (https://umanitoba.ca/libraries/) to find items in the UM collections
- 2) Once you have the search results, make sure you **sign in** to request items (use your email username without @myumanitoba.ca as your UMNet ID and the password)
- 3) Click on the title of the desired item
- 4) Scroll down to "Get it"
- 5) Click "Request"

6) In the "**Pick up location**", select "*Elizabeth Dafoe Library Hold Locker*" if the book you're looking for is located at Elizabeth Dafoe Library.
