

Manitoba Pulse & Soybean Growers Resources for Farmers and Agronomists

Manitoba Pulse & Soybean Growers (MPSG) is a non-profit commodity group organization representing roughly 4,000 farmers in Manitoba who grow soybeans and pulses (peas, dry edible beans, lentils and faba beans). MPSG invests in research and provides production knowledge and market development support to achieve the goal of sustainably producing profitable, quality pulse and soybean crops in Manitoba.

There are several resources available to agronomists. The *Bean Report* is a newsletter sent throughout the growing season offering timely agronomic information. The On-Farm Network provides research results from trials conducted with farmers across Manitoba on a variety of seeding and spraying topics. Regional variety trials evaluate the performance of soybean and pulse varieties at locations across Manitoba annually and are shared through MPSG's *Pulse and Soybean Variety Guide*. Printed, laminated factsheets and guides are available for use in the field along with MPSG's *Bean App*, which offers interactive calculators and tools. New guides developed in the last two years include a pea fungicide decision worksheet, desiccation and harvest guides for peas and dry beans, insect and disease identification guides and more.
