What is the study of Central and East European Studies?

The Central and East European Studies program offers students an opportunity to gain understanding of this crucial part of Europe through interdisciplinary study of the region's history, politics, languages, literatures and cultures.

The program draws upon the expertise of faculty from across the university in order to train a new generation of specialists with solid knowledge of the cultures and societies of Central and Eastern Europe and their global relevance and impact both past and present.

What is unique about Central and East European Studies at UM?

The Central and East European Studies program is a unique interdisciplinary program at the University of Manitoba. The program integrates study from multiple departments, languages and faculties. Courses in this program investigate such topics as: state formation/democratization; social, political, cultural and religious history; role of language; security including terrorism, human trafficking and organized crime; refugees and displaced peoples; the arts and contemporary society and more. Public talks, guests from Europe, conferences and video/film screenings are organized in conjunction with this program throughout the year. There are also several active student clubs that enhance out-of-class learning.
