



Tips for Success

Advance Preparation

- Locate your classrooms
- Test the wifi / Log in to UM Learn / set up your UM student email
- Use the syllabus (course outline)
- Mark down deadline dates make a "term at a glance"
- Complete ALL assigned readings/chapters



The Syllabus

- Syllabus is a contract between the student and professor
- Contains:
 - Contact info and office hours
 - Expectations for term work and exams
 - Important dates and deadlines
 - Required materials
 - Optional materials
 - Marking guide
- Print it out AND save a copy to your device of choice



Tips for Success

Attentive Participation

- Take notes during class
- Turn off phone / extra devices ONLY focus on your class!
- Earn your participation marks
- Sit in the T-zone



Tips for Success

Meet Your Instructors

- Visit during office hours
- Introduce yourself early in the term
- Don't forget about teaching assistants
- Be respectful




