Can my books be in any condition?

They have to be in good condition, but can be highlighted, underlined, or stamped 'used'.

If I buy used books, can I sell them back?

Yes! As long as they are current editions and have been reconfirmed for the following term.

When is the best time to sell new and used textbooks to the BookStore?

From early August to the first week of classes in September, and from November to the first week of classes in January.

What is the advantage of selling the books to the BookStore? We pay CASH up-front.

Where do I sell my books?

During rush weeks - right outside the BookStore. Other times - at the Customer Service Desk.

Textbook Production


- Textbooks are written by experts in their fields.
