## **EDUB 4102 - Themes in Senior Years Education**

There are three topics offered for *Themes in Senior Years Education*.

### **Section T29 – Human Rights in the Language Arts**

This course invites students to explore power, voice and agency through writing and the teaching of writing as and for human rights. Students will engage in multidisciplinary, place-based explorations, writing provocations, anti-racist writing workshops, connections to powerful writing pedagogies for all content areas, and the sharing of promising practices from experienced educators from the Manitoba Writing Project. Although there is “Language Arts” in the title, please remember that reading, writing, speaking, listening, viewing, representing, and all the ways we make meaning are present in all that we do. Writing will be understood from a multimodal perspective so visual, auditory, and performative forms of writing will be encouraged.

### **Section T32 – Human Rights in the Sciences**

The history of humanity’s pursuit of knowledge and the various practices associated to sciences (not only Western science, but also Indigenous and non-Western, multicultural science) will be explored in connection to human rights. We will discuss practices and abilities associated with the pursuit of knowledge as science, and how these connect to different subject area curricula in Manitoba. Although there is “Science” in the title, please remember that trying to find answers to our most basic as well as the most sophisticated questions about our universe and our place in it are part of being human.

### **Section T33 – Human Rights in the Humanities**

We will discuss social justice, ecopedagogy, hegemonic powers and structures in light of human rights issues, and make connections to your role as senior years teacher. Although there is “Humanities” in the title, please remember that humans share the same history and geography, albeit very different stories get to be known and shared depending on issues of power and politics. The skills and practices associated to the various areas in humanities and social sciences will be explored in connection to human rights.
