Additional Notes

- 1. As part of the course fees the Department will buy a compass and field notebook for you. We will also supply you with a stereonet and paper for producing the final copies of your maps.
- 2. You must have adequate gear for field work, because we work in all types of conditions (sunny, rain, snow, etc..) and different terrains (rock, bush, swamp, etc..). Footwear is extremely important; running shoes are not allowed on traverses and flip flops are not allowed on outcrops.
- 3. We supply reflective vests for any work along roadways. First aid kits will be available at the Star Lake field camp and each instructor.
- 4. Geologic hammers (1 or 2 lb.) are important tools used by geologists to collect rock samples. In this course, a geologic hammer is not necessary. If you bring one, its use will be restricted. In Advanced Field Mapping (GEOL 4910) a geologic hammer is an important tool to take rock samples, which can be used to help with your field mapping. You will probably want one.
